[The Lehigh Valley High School Basketball Hall of Fame](#) announced its four 2009 inductees today.

The inductees are:

- **Traci Cyr**, Easton High School player, class of 1986. As a coach at [Notre Dame High School](#) from 1990 to 2001, Cyr became the Lehigh Valley coach with the highest winning percentage record.
- **Truman Frey**, Bethlehem High School player, class of 1937. He made 1st team All-State. Frey was the founder of the Eyeglass Fund Basketball game in 1948. Through his work, the game became recognized throughout Pennsylvania and beyond as one of the top charity/exhibition high school events.
- **Ken Lacey**, [Stroudsburg High School](#) player, class of 1996. While at Stroudsburg, Lacey scored 1,096 points and 647 rebounds in two years and earned two Mountain Valley Conference Titles.
- **Joseph "Jody" Silvester**, [Bethlehem Catholic High School](#), class of 1955. High School Division 1 and 22-year NCAA Official. He retired from officiating in 2000. He was one of a few long-time Division 1 officials.

The inductees will be honored at the [Via All-Star Banquet](#), presented by East Penn Bank on March 25.

The Hall of Fame was established in 1978 and honors individuals who have made outstanding contributions to high school basketball in the Lehigh Valley.
