EAST STROUDSBURG — Mike Green, a noted drug and alcohol awareness speaker, recently held a presentation for East Stroudsburg University student-athletes as part of ESU's educational programming during the academic year.

Green, a former collegiate athlete and nationally-recognized consultant, addressed the student-athletes on a number of drug and alcohol-related issues. As a recovering alcoholic, he spoke of his first-hand experiences to raise awareness of the seriousness of these issues on college campuses.

Green has developed drug and alcohol programs for New Jersey high schools at the request of former U.S. Senator Bill Bradley and has also produced programs for medical societies and professional sports teams, including the Philadelphia Flyers. He has also provided expert testimony in hearings before the U.S. House of Representatives.

An All-PSAC defensive lineman and coach at West Chester University, Green has also served as a high school athletic director and had a tryout with the Philadelphia Eagles after his collegiate career.

ESU's series of educational programs for student-athletes has also included knowledge to achieve academic success, hazing education and prevention and diversity and social justice education.
